CAVERN CLUB, LIVERPOOL: The sad death of Cilla Black reminded Mart of the many times the Zenith Six played at the Cavern Club before the Beatles etc. replaced the traditional jazz bands. Cilla, of course, was the cloakroom girl before she became a famous singer and TV presenter. One night when it was very foggy Mart made his way to play at the Cavern via Warrington but the other members of the Zenith Six travelled along the East Lancs. Road. When Mart arrived Ray McFall told him that the rest of the band were fog-bound and had phoned to say they couldn't get there. A local band had been booked quickly to step in for them and so Mart made his way straight back home. He decided he deserved a quick pint before going in so called at the pub in the village. He joined his neighbour at the bar — who had been there since his train journey home from work hours before. The neighbour's wife suddenly rushed into the pub, gave her husband a thorough dressing down for not going home for his tea, then turned to Mart and told him he should be ashamed of himself drinking there when his "poor wife was stuck at home with that little baby". She didn't know that he had been home, had his tea, then driven to Liverpool and back in very thick fog!

DOUG JACKSON, AUTHOR: We have known Doug for many years, in fact, since he was a Jazz Reporter on the Stockport Advertiser when Mart returned from National Service in 1956! We still have some of the articles Doug wrote each week in his regular jazz columns. Doug wrote the sleeve notes for the band's early recordings and we were interested to hear that he was writing a book. Doug explained that his book was about Joseph Briggs who was born in Accrington but made his name with the artist in glass Louis Comfort Tiffany in New York.
