#### THOMSON DESTINY CRUISE:

We left Manchester Airport on Sunday, 11th April to fly to the Dominican Republic to board the ship, "Destiny". We had 3 deps with us this cruise as Allan, Roger and Charlie were unable to come with us. We invited Dennis Armstrong, Malcolm Hogarth and Mike Reddin along to play in their places and After all the passengers were on board, the ship they did a great job. sailed to Tortola. Each day we visited a different island, St. Maarten, Antiqua, Dominica, St. Lucia and lastly Barbados before leaving on 17<sup>th</sup> April for the six day crossing of the Atlantic. The Caribbean band who had been on board all winter left the ship there, but the new band who should have arrived in Barbados were still in Frankfurt because of the volcanic ash-cloud which had closed the European air-space for a considerable time. However as they were booked to be on "Destiny" for the whole summer season, their performances were only delayed by two weeks. On board were our good friends, Dee We presented a framed certificate to Dee and John celeand John Curtis. brating the fact that they had been on every one of the six cruises we have Other friends we knew from past cruises included Anne & Eddie Fagan, Allan and Barbara, Harold and Olwen. Sorry if your name's not here - we know so many friends by sight without actually knowing their names. The other passengers were very surprised to see a Brolly Parade one night and it was so popular that we were asked to do it again the following week. How often we were told: "I don't like jazz but I like what you do!" steel-drummer, Trevor, who played with the Caribbean band "Rhapsody", joined the band on his final evening aboard. "Sweet Georgia Brown" and "The Saints" were the numbers played and the whole band was amazed that Trevor could play in any key on his steel drum.

When singer, Elkie Brooks came on it was very nice that she dedicated her song to Humph's manager, Susan Da Costa, who was in the audience. When Humph and Susan came to Mart's house for dinner many years ago, Humph drew his autographed cartoon of himself on three sheets of paper giving one each to Simon, Andrew and Claire Rodger. Claire was only 4 at the time and for her Humph changed the cartoon from his usual one of him playing his trumpet to a special drawing of him with Claire. The cartoons had remained in a drawer for many years and before Christmas last year Mart had them framed as a special gift to each of the family. They now have pride of place in their homes!

TWO MORE TRIPS TO NORWAY: We look forward to playing at the Skagen Brygge Hotel in Stavanger on Saturday, 23<sup>rd</sup> October, and we will also be playing at the Stavanger Jazz Festival again on 21<sup>st</sup> to 23rd January 2011. Roy played with the band on the 14-day-tour of East Germany in 1989 as our regular pianist, Joe Palin, was unable to be with us. Geoffrey Smith played "Little Rock Getaway" by Joe Sullivan for Roy. The following week JRR played a request for "Hum Drum Blues", sung by our good friend, Marion Montgomery which was recorded in August 1963. Marion sang with the band at more than 10 concerts between 1990 and her sad death in 2002, including the "Sunbird" cruise that year. Our CD, "Makin' Whoopee" with Marion was recorded in 1992 and it is still very popular.
