JOAN PENDLEBURY: Widow of trombonist, Alan Pendlebury, and mother of our drummer, Chris, Joan celebrated a "big" birthday recently. One of her relatives told her he would like to take her out for lunch that day and as they approached the restaurant he told her that as they were a bit early they could pop into a nearby pub for a drink first. To Joan's enormous surprise as she walked in the door, the band started playing "Happy Birthday" to her, following it with "Celebrations". She could not believe that all her family were there, together with her many friends! The band played all afternoon and everyone had a brilliant time! Joan's sister-in-law, Marcia Pendlebury, sang a couple of numbers with the band too. During the afternoon Joan and Janet were reminiscing about the two-week cruise on QE2 that the Alan Pendlebury Band played on in July 1984. As Alan's clarinet-player was unable to go on the cruise, Mart was asked if he would like to take his place. Mart was delighted to do this and it was the first time that he and Janet visited Norway (36 times with the band since!) The cruise took in the whole distance of the Norwegian coastline from Stavanger to North Cape, including visiting the fiords at Geiranger and Vik. A lovely two-week trip!

ALLAN DENT: Everyone will be pleased to hear that Allan has returned to the band now after his recent illness and he is feeling much better. We always remember that in one of Humphrey Lyttelton's weekly programmes on BBC Radio 2, Humph told his audience that Allan's playing "slips and slides like a bar of soap in the shower"!
