"THE MURDER ROAD" BY STEPHEN BOOTH: One evening recently a good friend phoned Mart and told him that he was reading a book by his favourite author and that Mart's band was mentioned in the book. Our friend was reading "The Murder Road" by Stephen Booth, which is a crime story told around the New Mills He came to Page No. 73 and was amazed to see that the author referred to a concert by Mart Rodger area. Manchester Jazz in the Torr Vale Mill situated in the Torrs gorge in New Mills. This concert took place there in 2013 and the book reports that the band was "pretty good too"! It was pretty good that Stephen Booth spelt Mart's name correctly, which is guite a rare event as many people manage to miss out the "d" and add an unnecessary "s". Mart was phoned to ask if he would speak on the radio on Howard Leader's Sunday afternoon programme as he had done in June 2012. This was to be on the Sunday before the gig so that it could get some publicity. Mart talked about his times in jazz and told Howard that the last time he played in Cleethorpes was with the Zenith Six in about 1962! Howard played two of the band's recordings. The first was appropriately called "East Coast Trot" which is from Mart's solo recording "Allmart". After interviewing Mart, Howard played the second track and mentioned that "Saving All My Pennies" was requested quite frequently on his programme. Mart told him that this number was written by Colin Smith, our bass-player who retired from the band a few years ago. During the concert at Cleethorpes, which was held in a marquee at the Cricket Field, the audience shouted for this number to be played!
